OBITUARY

Turia Dell Marshall was a teacher. Destined so by the Divinity that shaped the very ends of his life.

He was born during the first generation of race's freedom in the little community of Millican, Texas.

Although his parents have been a long time in the Father's House, T. D. Marshall did not disappoint their dreams.

He was the only son of Edmond Lott and Texana Marshall. When his mother died at the time of his third birthday, he was brought to Dallas by his grandmother, the beloved Mrs. Laura Dixon.

From childhood he was a member of Saint Paul Methodist Church. During his long active service to the work of higher education, he was never too busy for his church or his Sunday School Class.

He was married to Miss Anna E. Shields in 1901 by the late Rev. Dr. N. J. Johnson, pastor of St. Paul Church. To this union one daughter, Imogene was born. She preceded him in death in February of 1921 while in her senior year at Wiley College.

His preparation for the magnificent services he rendered as a teacher, educator and school administrator was done in his Christian home, his church, Dallas Public School, Hearne Academy, Wiley College and Prairie View A. & M. College. He received his B.A. degree from Wiley and his M.A. degree from Prairie View.

He was with the Dallas Public Schools forty-four years. As a teacher he served Queen City, Dallas High and Starks Schools. As a principal he served Pacific Avenue, Wheatley, Darrell, Booker T. Washington and Lincoln. He retired from the Dallas Independent School District in 1955.

He was the father of higher education in our section of the Dallas community. In 1927 he organized Wiley College Extension School in Dallas. Also he organized the evening classes for adults in Darrell.

He was a trustee of Wiley College for forty years, and holds a long service record with the Y. M. C. A. and one of the founders of the Dallas Star Post. He was Church School Superintendent, steward, trustee, chairman of the Board of Education and a devout and faithful member in his church.

He is survived by his faithful wife of 59 years, Mrs. A. E. Marshall, two nephews and one niece.

Now he belongs to the tomorrows.
