Arthur Hugh Carter was the son of Ethel and Idella Irby Carter. He was born in Panola County, Mississippi. His parents, his brother (Henry Carter) and his sister (Ora Carter Wilson) predeceased him.

Arthur joined the McIvor Creek Missionary Baptist Church at an early age. He has served as an adult Sunday school teacher; a deacon for more than twenty years; and as church treasurer for many years. He supported his church, spiritually and financially.
