Obituary

Martha Jeannette Williams, daughter of Joseph and Martha Sumter, was born in Sumter, South Carolina, December 6, 1886 and departed this life Saturday morning, April 28th, 1979 in her residence. She lived her childhood years in Sumter and later met Mr. Ephriam Williams. They were united in marriage, January 10, 1910. To this union of almost 43 years, five children were born. Mr. Ephriam Williams passed away November 18, 1952

Mother Williams confessed her hope in Christ at an early age and became a member of the Mt. Zion Methodist Church, Sumpter S.C. She was an active member there until the family moved to Pittsburgh, Pa., in 1924. She began attending the Morning Star Baptist Church under the Pastorate of the late Rev. A.J. Fike. When Morning Star was legally Chartered in 1934, she was among the Charter Members. She served as Church Secretary, was a member of the Missionary Society and served with many other Auxiliaries of the Church.
