OBITUARY



At 1:30 A.M., the early morning of January 14, 1968, the family and community lost a truly Christian woman and leader.

Emily Eunice Miller Hightower was born February 9th, 1881, being the youngest of two girls and of eight boys born to Jack and Pricillia Miller of Winchester, Tenn. This was a family rooted in Christian principles and honesty.

In 1899 she was married to Robert Houston Hightower. From this union were born four boys (one died in infancy). They made their home in Sardis, Mississippi, where they soon joined Miles Chapel C.M.E. Church. This was the beginning of a great church career that led both to local, state and national prominence.

She exemplified the true meaning of stewardship in her church and auxiliaries. She was the organizer of Sardis Court, Heroins of Jericho and was an official in the Eastern Star.

Left to mourn her death is a devoted husband, Robert Houston Hightower, Sardis, Miss.; two sons, Thomas E. Hightower, Baldwin, L. I., N. Y., and Oliver F.
