Obituary

John "Johnny" Mack, Sr., entered into eternal rest July 15, 2016. Johnny was born on January 11, 1944 in Charleston, SC to Sadie and the late Isiah Mack, Sr. He was educated in Charleston County Public Schools. He attended Liberty Hill Elementary and Bonds-Wilson High Schools. While attending Bonds-Wilson, he became a star basketball player. He entered the United States Navy in 1962 immediately following graduation on the buddy system with Curtis Abraham. He served only a year and a half before a military accident aboard the USS Hancock which disabled him. Following this accident, Johnny returned to Charleston and later moved to Connecticut. He married the love of his life, Beverly Ann Stewart, on August 11, 1966 and to this union two children were born, John Darrell Mack and Byron Steven Mack. They moved back to Charleston in 1968. Upon their return, Johnny took classes at Rice Business College and graduated with a degree in Accounting. He later became employed as an accountant with the Charleston Naval Supply Center and retired after 19 years.

Johnny never allowed his disability to hinder him from doing anything that he wanted to do. He drove cars without any special hand controls. He took care of his home by doing anything any able bodied adult could do from climbing a ladder to cutting down trees. His backyard became the spot for many of his friends to come and have some of the most interesting conversations. Despite losing both legs, the biggest loss he suffered was burying both of his sons, John Darrell Mack and Byron Steven Mack.

He leaves to cherish his memories, his loving wife, Beverly Mack; grandson, Tony Singleton; great granddaughters, Jaylin Singleton and Cheyenne Singleton; his mother, Sadie Mack; siblings, Bertha "Sister" Bryant, Jeanette (Deacon Willie) McFadden, Martha Ann Holmes, Tony Mack, Michael Mack and Mark Mack; brothers-in-law, Rev. Hezekiah (Diane) Stewart and Mark (Sonia) Stewart; sister-in-law, Delores Stewart; adopted grandson, Terry (Nicole) Singleton; adopted great grandson, Terry Singleton, Jr.; adopted great grand daughter, Ja'Nayah Brown; adopted brother, Curtis Abraham; devoted friend, Harry Wallace; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
