Clarence served in the U.S. Army and received The Army of Occupation Medal, The Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, and The World War II Victory Medal. He was honorably discharged in November 1946.

Clarence was a faithful member of Mt. Pleasant A.M.E. Church in Owings Mills, Maryland for 80 years. For the majority of those years, he was the church musician for all the choirs and played the organ, piano, and keyboard. He would also lead a song from time to time. One of his favorite songs was "*I Am Redeemed.*" Known as "The Ram in The Bush," he always accompanied the pastor to other church services outside of Mt. Pleasant without hesitation. Clarence also served on The Trustee Board for many years.
