

Obituary

Altomae B. Hart passed away on July 3, 2015 at Vibra Hospital surrounded by her loving family. She was born in Lee County, SC on November 15, 1934. She was the daughter of the late Alford K. Burris and Phiphine Wood Burris. She was a faithful member of Mount Zion United Methodist Church until going off to college in 1952. She received her early education from Brockington High School in Timmonsville, SC.
