# Declaration for Invalid Pension.

Act of June 27, 1890.

To be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. The official character and signature of any such officer not required by law to use a seal must be certified by the clerk of the proper court, giving dates of beginning and close of official term. If certificate on file so state.

State of South Carolina, County of Beaufort, B.B.:  
On this 29 day of April, A.D. one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven  
personally appeared before me, a Notary Public,  
within and for the County and State aforesaid,  
aged 65 years, a resident of the Post Office of Burkeville  
County of Bullion, State of S.C., who, being  
duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical London Vandross  
who was ENROLLED on the 28 day of March, 1865, in Co  
Co 103<sup>rd</sup> Regt U.S.C.S. Here state rank, company  
and regiment, if in the Army, or vessel, if in the Navy

.....in the service of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and served at least ninety days,  
and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at.....*Frank Plaski*....., on the.....day of

March 1866 That he is  $\frac{3}{4}$  of his time unable to earn a support by manual labor by reason of *Rupture, heart disease, and rheumatism*.  
Here name the disease or injuries from which disabled.  
*pain around his neck*

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, of a permanent character.

That he has now applied for pension, under application No. 1000000000, First class pension.

under Certificate No. 1234567890

That he has never been employed in the MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICE otherwise than as stated above.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Act of June 27, 1890. He hereby appoints

his true and lawful Attorney , to prosecute his claim, and he directs that the sum of Ten Dollars be paid to said Attorney

The Act of June 27, 1890, REQUIRES in case of a soldier:

1. An honorable discharge (but the certificate need not be filed unless called for.)
2. A minimum service of ninety days.
3. A permanent physical disability not due to vicious habits. (It need not have originated in the service.)
4. The rates under the act are graded from \$6 to \$12, proportioned to the degree of inability to earn a support, and are not affected by the rank held.
5. A pensioner under prior laws may apply under this one, or a pensioner under this one may apply under other laws, but he cannot draw more than ONE pension for the same period.
