The Obituary

Neal "Connie" Frazier was born on December 20, 1936 to the late James and Edna Mae Frazier of Ridgeland, South Carolina. She is a 1957 graduate of Burke High School, Charleston, SC. She became a member of Ferry Field Baptist Church at an early age. She was a faithful member of the Usher Board. She later relocated to New York City. She was employed at Hotel Tudor for 25 years. After retirement, in 1990, Neal moved back to Johns Island to unite with family and friends. She reinstated her membership at Ferry Field Missionary Baptist Church. She served as a faithful member of the Usher Board until her health began to fail. She then relocated to Charleston, SC with her daughter (caregiver) until her death.

Neal loved cooking, gardening, and ironing. She was a devoted baby sitter to several children (Kayla, Jordan, Brandon, Kimberly, Justin, Bernardica, Kai and Ty) whom called her so faithfully "Granny". She was known among her family and friends as the Fashion Queen. Her doors were always open wide.
