Deacon Robert Redmond Phillips was born to the parentage of the late Mr. Percy Phillips, Sr. and the late Mrs. Miranda Tipton Phillips on January 6, 1930 in Carroll County, Mississippi.

He was the sixth child born to this union. Four siblings preceded him in death- Mr. Percy Phillips, Jr., Mr. Jack Phillips, Mr. Hugh L. Phillips, and Mrs. Ida Mae Phillips Green.

#### The Induction

Deacon Phillips accepted Christ as his personal Savior at an early age and entered into fellowship with the Mt. Pleasant Missionary Baptist Church, Black Hawk, Mississippi. He received his formal education in the schools of Carroll County.

#### Active Duty

Deacon Phillips served well. Working actively in Mt. Pleasant, he committed himself to the Deacon Ministry, seeking tirelessly to edify for the cause of Christ and leading in the renovation of the church building. Though residing in Batesville, Mississippi, Deacon Phillips was a faithful supporter of the total program of the church. Because of failing health and because of his strong desire to stay in Christian fellowship, he entered into covenant relationship with the Macedonia M.B. Church, Batesville, Mississippi, serving loyally in the Deacon Ministry until the time of his transition. In his life's vocation, Deacon Phillips worked in the construction industry, serving as the owner of Phillips' Construction Company. Many of the buildings in the surrounding

communities are the results of his labor. He served as a mentor to the youth of this area, giving them an opportunity to learn and to become proficient in building trades under his instruction. Answering his country's call, he served in the United States Armed Services from 1951 to 1953.
