I'm Free

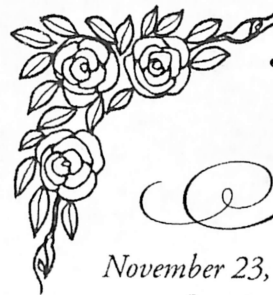
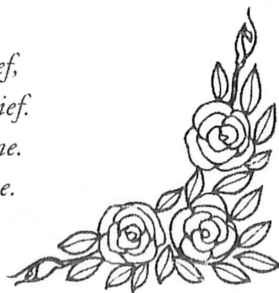
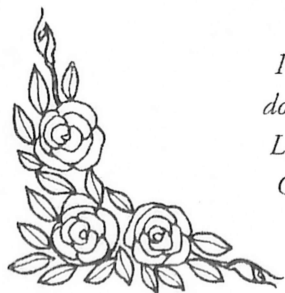
*Don't grieve for me now I'm Free

Obituary

Juanita Lee (Suukey) was born Juanita Shaw on November 23, 1916 in Greenwood, Louisiana. She attended school at the Mount Olive Missionary Baptist Church through the eighth grade and was also a devoted member. In the mid 1930's, Juanita began working at Charity Hospital in Shreveport, Louisiana. It was while working for Charity Hospital that she would meet Singleton Lee (Sr.); her husband to be.

In 1939, Juanita Shaw married Singleton Lee (Uncle S.L.) and became Juanita Lee. In 1940 Juanita gave birth to their son Alvoid Singleton Lee (Jr.). 1957 was the year Juanita became a member of Trinity Baptist Church. She taught Sunday School and was an active member of Debora Circle until the early 1990's when she could no longer participate.

Juanita loved to knit, sew, cook, care for the family and shop. She was married to Singleton Lee (Uncle S.L.) for 60 awesome years until his homecoming in 1999. Alvoid Singleton Lee was called home in 1995. Juanita lives in the memories of Grandsons: Anthony Lee and Douglas Lee, Granddaughter: Elan Lee, Great Granddaughter: Jasmine Rocheal Lee and Great Grandson: Michael Wayne Lee.
