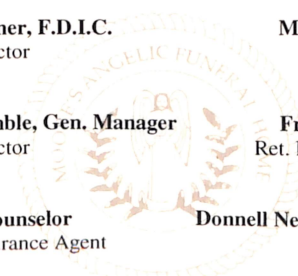

Swanson was the youngest child of the late Reverend Frederick McIlveen and the late LaKatie Jordan McIlveen. He was born in the Teague General Hospital, Teague, Texas on December 28, 1949. Mr. McIlveen went to be with the Lord on Thursday, January 12, 2006 in the Dallas Veterans Administration Medical Center, Dallas, Texas.

Swanson grew up in Fairfield, Texas; however, as the son of a Baptist Preacher who pastored a number of churches, he has lived in Madisonville, Texas, Bay City, Texas and Houston, Texas.

He was baptized by his father, and Swanson was a member of the Charity Baptist Church of Houston.

Mr. McIlveen graduated from Phyllis Wheatly High School of Houston, and received a B.S. Degree in Computer Science from Texas A&M University at Commerce. He did additional study at the American University, Washington, D.C.

Swanson was honorably discharged from the U. S. Air Force after serving a tour of duty overseas and in the states.

He was employed by McDonald Douglas Air Craft, Washington, D. C., NASA Space Center of Houston, and taught in the Windham School District.

Swanson was an avid reader, had a firm faith in God, was well-versed on biblical history, and enjoyed discourse in the area of Philosophy and Religion. He was interested in all sports and was especially fond of football.

Mr. McIlveen was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, Dr. Alvin McIlveen, and two nephews: Michael McIlveen and James Booker, Jr.
