OBITUARY

John Nathan Livingston was born September 26, 1891. He died July 31, 1978. He was the third child of the late Jeff and Maria Livingston.

John Nathan joined Longs Chapel Methodist Church at an early age and remained a faithful member until his health failed.

He received his education from Wiley College, Marshall, Texas. He taught in the public schools of Freestone County for a great number of years.

John Nathan was a noted farmer and Cattleman. He was also a Veteran of World War I and received an honorable discharge.

He loved people and enjoyed reciting poetry to his friends and relatives. He was always willing to lend a helping hand. He was known as "Fess", "President" and "Uncle John".

He united in Holy Matrimony with Mrs. Cornelius Cummings Livingston on January 20, 1940. He remained with her until death by accident in September 1964.
