Life Reflections


lbert Harvey Evans was born December 2, 1935 in Lawrence County, Mississippi to the late Lit Parker Evans and Myrtle B. Baylis Evans.

Albert confessed hope in Christ at Oak Grove Missionary Baptist Church under the leadership of Rev. Brown in Monticello, Mississippi. After moving to Batesville, he joined New Bethlehem Missionary Baptist church. He served as a member of the trustee board and the choir until his health failed.

Harvey, as he was affectionately known, attended the public schools of Lawrence County, Mississippi. After graduating from high school, he attended Alcorn State University in Lorman, Mississippi where he received a Bachelor of Science degree. He served 30 years as educator in the South Panola School District and 25 years of service with the Corps of Engineers. He was affiliated with the following organizations: lifetime member of Alcorn State University National Alumni Association, Retired Teachers Association—State and National, and a member of the Supervisory Committee of the former Panola County Teachers & Educators Federal Credit Union.

On June 16, 1963, Albert was joined in holy matrimony to Margaret Louise Jones. To this union, three children were born. In 1995, he suffered kidney failure and was placed on dialysis. And for 10 years, he fought this battle.





He departed this life on June 23, 2005 at 9:30 a.m. at Baptist Memorial Hospital in Oxford, MS.
