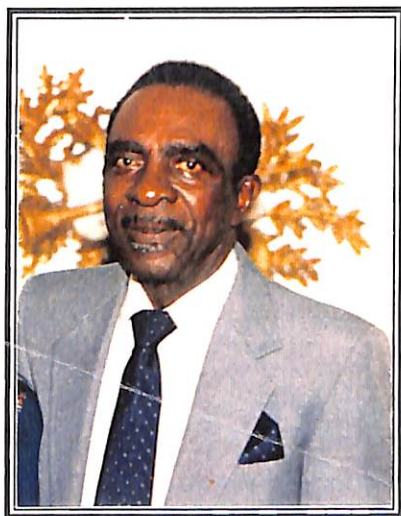

Obituary

Mr. Percy Quincy Turner (Q.T.) Hathorn was born August 17, 1917 to the late Arter Avery and Clara Kelly Hathorn in Winston County, Mississippi. Percy became a member of Mt. Pleasant #2 M.B. Church as a youngster, and remained active until his health failed. He served in many capacities. As assistant Sunday School Supt., Deacon Chairmanship and Educational Director. He grew up in the Mount Pleasant community, attended Hathorn School and graduated from Louisville High School. After one year at Alcorn College he was drafted into the U.S. Army, where he served his country in the Persian Gulf area for three and a half years.

Upon being discharged he returned to Alcorn, where he received his degree in Agriculture (his love). He began his teaching career in Winston County. Later he worked briefly in Montgomery County teaching veterans on the farm training.

Moving to Carroll County he began work at Carroll County Agricultural High School. In 1955 he became principal of Vaiden Jr. High School where he served until a school grades 1-12 was built and he remained as principal until he retired in 1984. Upon retirement the school was re-named Percy Hathorn Public School.

Percy was affiliated with many organizations; Life member of Carroll County Association of Educators, Mississippi Association of Educators, National Association of Educators, Carroll County Voters League, Carroll County NAACP, Estes Masonic Lodge #63, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc.

To cherish memories of him is a loving and devoted wife Omeria Murff Hathorn of Vaiden, MS, four daughters; Anita Elaine Hathorn of Memphis, TN, Karla Yvette Hathorn of Smyrna, GA, Percetta Denise Collins (Walter) of Clinton, MS, and Vicki Helene Hathorn of Clinton, MS. One grandson Carson Matthew Collins. Two brothers; Booker T. Hathorn (Indiana) of Louisville, MS and Robert F.
