

ORITUARY

Elder Obie Theodore Hines departed this life on Friday, November 24, 1978 at 4:50 p.m. Born at Shelby County, Tennessee, the ninth child of Berry and Idella Hines

He was educated in Shelby County Schools of Tennessee.

On October 24, 1949, he married the congenial personality of Ida Mae Cunningham. No children were born to this union.

In 1954, he dedicated his life to Christ and united with New Jerusalem Church of God in Christ. To demonstrate his zeal for Christ, he served as Sunday School Teacher and later Sunday School Superintendent. Elder Hines was determined to exhaust his energy for God, this was demonstrated by him serving Tennessee First Jurisdiction as District Sunday School Superintendent under the leadership of Elder B. T. Harris. He also served as State Manager of the Y. P. W. W. Department under Elder L. M. Haley.

In 1955, Elder Hines was called into the ministry. In order to communicate the gospel more effectively he studied at the Baptist Theological School of Religion and participated in many Theological Seminars.

Elder Hines was appointed a member of the Ordination Board of First Jurisdiction of Tennessee at the time of his death he served as chairman of this board.

Elder Hines began his pastorage under an apple tree in an orchard in Berclair, Tennessee. Later, the Lord spoke to his heart and he built a mission for Christ adjoining his home. It is still there today and is held sacred. He ended pastorage at his home on March 1971 and was appointed to serve as pastor at Gateway Church of God in Christ where he was pastoring at the time of his death.

Elder Hines was a zealous and studious preacher. He worked diligently with young ministers.

He will be sadly missed by the members of his family. He leaves to mourn his lost, a loving and devoted wife, Mrs. !da Mae Hines; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Berry Hines, Sr. of Memphis; three sisters, Mrs. Susie Mangum, Mrs. Ruth Hunt and Miss Louise Hines, all of Memphis; five brothers, Berry Hines, Jr. of Chicago, Illinois, Howard Hines of Cleveland, Ohio, Russell Hines, Sr. of Memphis, Robert L. Hines of St. Louis and Otis Hines of Vallejo, California; a dearly beloved niece, Anne Mae Burns of Memphis; nine sisters-in-law, three brothers-in-law, a host of others nieces, nephews, a host of other relatives, friends and a devoted membership grieves his home-going.
