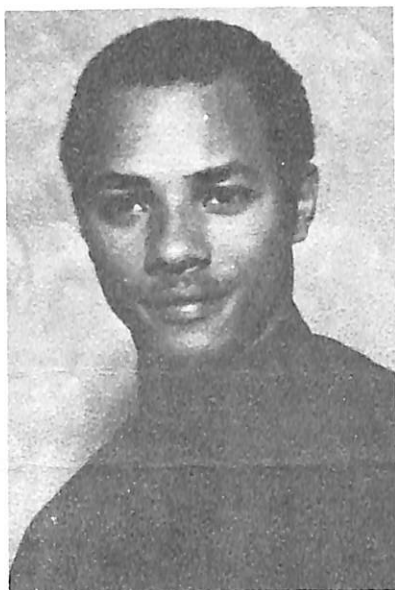

Obituary

January 12, 1968 — May 17, 1987

Lloyd A. Wilson, the loving son of Mr. Joseph, Sr. and Mamie Wilson, entered eternal rest, May 17, 1987, aboard the U.S.S. Stark FFG, in the Persian Gulf off the coast of Iraq.

He joined St. Patrick Catholic Church at the age of one year.

His formative years were spent in the Summerville community. Having moved to Charleston in 1973, where he attended Sacred Heart School and Bishop England High School, May 1981.

After high school he attended DeVry College in Atlanta, Ga. and Trident Technical College in North Charleston, S.C.

Lloyd entered the Navy in May, 1983. His basic training was completed in July, 1983 in San Diego, Calif. While in the service he completed prescribed courses of instructions in Interior Communications and basic electricity-electronics in Service School Command in San Diego, Calif.

He became a member of the Soleum Mysteries of the Ancient Order of Shellbacks in June, 1985.

He leaves to mourn his passing, his mother, Ms. Mamie C. Wilson; his father, Mr. Joseph Wilson, Sr.; three brothers, Joseph J. of Charleston, Michael of Summerville, ECON Jerome of Cuba; one sister, Christella of Charleston; one sister-in-law, Audrey of Charleston; four nephews; one grand uncle; three grand aunts; nine uncles; eight aunts; six aunts-in-law; six uncles-in-law; a host of cousins, relatives, and friends.
