Life Reflections

Mrs. Iva Marine Jones Hinton was a decendent of two old families in Sardis, Mississippi. The Jones and Carter families.

On August 3, 1916, in Jericho, Arkansas, a great blessing encumbered the lives of King David and Iva Belle Jones. That precious gift of God became known as Iva Marine. She was fondly known by all who knew and loved her as "Dollye".

After attending grade school in the Sardis community, Dollye moved to Gulfport, MS to live with her aunt Mrs. Ophelia Carter Dubra and her husband Rev. C. H. Dubra. She attended Thirty-Third Avenue High School and received her diploma.

Dollye joined St. Mark United Methodist Church where her uncle Rev. C. H. Dubra was pastor. She was very active in the church and the community. Dollye served as Church School Superintendent and she organized the Children's Choir.

Dollye was united in Holy Matrimony to Mr. Jewel H. Hinton, the love of her life, on September 30, 1954 and relocated to Peoria, Illinois where she resided until March 2001. She immediately united with Bethel United Methodist Church where she served in many capacities. Dollye's membership included active service in the following organizations: Member of the United Methodist Women, Leader on the Council of Ministries, Leader of Administrative Board, Member of the Evangelism, Chairperson of the Mission Committee, Member of the Conference Committee on Nominations, Member of the Conference of the North Central Jurisdictional of Black Methodist for Church Renewal (BMCR), Sunday School Teacher, which was her gift. She gave her all to children. Not only did she nurture the souls of children, but she was their encourager, role model, tutor, and piano teacher.

Dollye served as President of the Urban League Membership in the NAACP. Approximately 35 years ago she coordinated a food pantry, which she served as director

for 10 years. She was also Co-Director of a feeding program that served thousands of meals to needy citizens and home bound seniors of Peoria.

Because of her achievements to the citizens of Peoria, Mayor Lowell Grieves proclaimed Sunday, February 11, 2001 as Mrs. Iva Marine Hinton Day.

Dollye was preceded in death by her parents, her husband, her adoptive son: Mr. James Ross; and her brothers: Mr. Eldred Ellsworth Jones, Mr. King David Jones, and Mr. Terrell Carter Jones.

She is survived by her adoptive children: Mrs. Marilyn Jones of Columbus, Ohio, Rev. Bradley Watkins of Atlanta, Georgia; her sister: Ms. Sadie O. Jones of Gulfport; brother: Mr. Alvin Ross Tucker of Memphis, Tennessee; nephew: Mr. Charles Evans (Marie) Dubra of Gulfport; a special nephew: Mr. Charles Herbert (Evelyn) Dubra of Pflugerville, Texas who cared for her until her death, and many nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.
