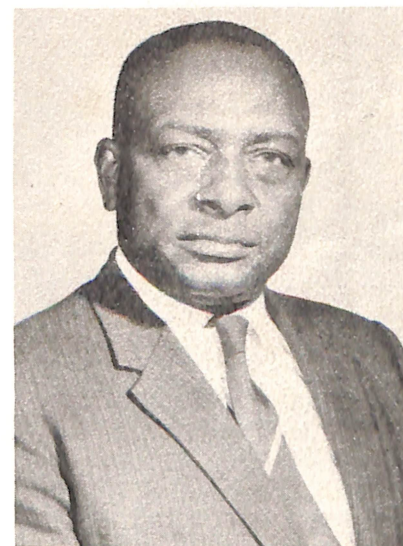

Mr. Randolph Titus, son of the late Henry and Lula Titus, was born in the Hopewell Community, Freestone County, Texas, where he received his early religious and educational training.
