OBITUARY

Dr. David Luther Chisholm was born May 23, 1913 in Frogmore, South Carolina to Mr. David Luther Chisholm and Mrs. Celia Bailey Chisholm.

He was educated at Penn School, Frogmore, S. C. He attended High School and College at Benedict College, Columbia, S. C. He received his Doctorate in Medicine from Meharry Medical College, Nashville, Tenn. Interned at St. Homer G. Phillips Hospital, St. Louis, Missouri. He practiced in Columbia, S. C. one year, at Tuskegee Veteran Administration Hospital two years, and came to Walterboro, S. C. in October, 1943 where he practiced until his death.

Dr. Chisholm was married to the former Willa Dixon. To this union two children were born, David Luther and George William.

He was a member of the National Medical Association, Executive Board member of Palmetto Medical Association and Charleston Medical Association. He also held an office in The Seaside Corporation. He was a former member of the Claflin College Board of Trustees and served on the Board of Trustees of Benedict College.

He served as an Elder of Hopewell United Presbyterian Church since 1963, held life time membership of the N. A. A. C. P. and spent a full life serving all mankind.

He is survived by his widow, Willa Dixon Chisholm; two sons, David Luther and George William; one uncle, Dr. Y. W. Bailey; and one brother, Leroy Chisholm.
