That a loving God knows best.



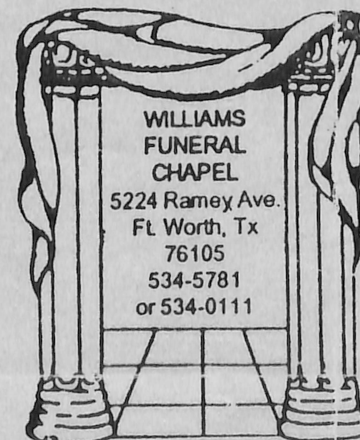

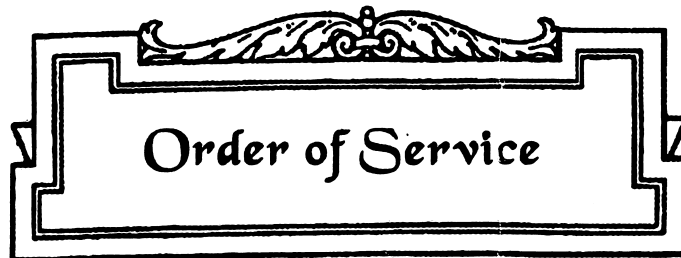

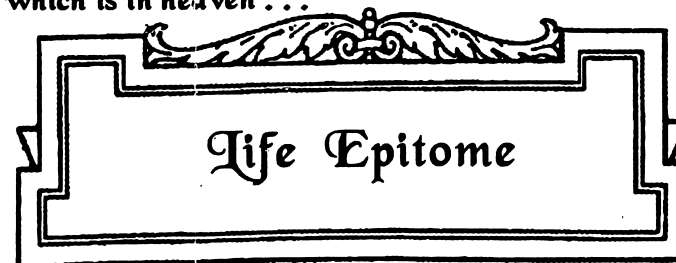

Australia L. King was born August 5, 1911 to the union of Mr. and Mrs. Early King in Marlin, Texas.

He attended high school in Mexia, Texas and graduated from Wiley College in Marshall, Texas on August 12, 1936 earning a B.A. degree. He furthered his education by earning a Masters degree on May 20, 1956 from Texas College at Tyler.

He was a World War II Veteran, serving his country proudly and was honorably discharged.

Australia married the love of his life, Ruby Morgan in June 1948. They remained married until her death in 1990.

He was a dedicated member of the Mayfield Baptist Church for over twenty years. He served as Chairman of the Deacon Board, Youth Director, and attended Brotherhood until his health failed him.

Convinced that education was the key to the advancement of the African American race, Australia dedicated himself to education. He served in public schools for over 32 years as teacher, coach, and principal. He retired in 1976. In addition to his service in public school, he was active as a fund raiser and Board Member of McDonald Branch of YMCA.

He leaves to mourn one brother Caldwell King, of Mexia, Texas, and a host of nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.
