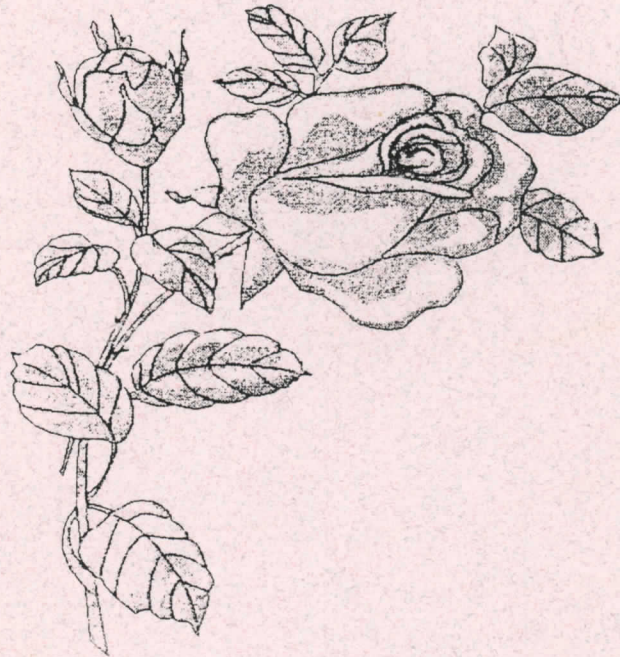

Obituary

Mrs. Agnes Elizabeth Amos Gibson, the daughter of the late Reverend Butler and Annie Amos, was born June 9, 1921 in Greenwood, Mississippi.

Agnes accepted Christ at an early age. She was a member of East Trigg Baptist Church where the late Dr. W. Herbert Brewster was the pastor. Later after being inspired by many radio gospel messages preached by Bishop G. E. Patterson, she began to support the Holy Temple broadcast and W. A. Patterson Annex building fund and later united along with her six children with the Holy Temple Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Bishop G. E. Patterson.

She was a retired Shelby County Teacher, founder and owner of GIBS Kindergarten, a preschool formerly located in the Walker Holmes area, a graduate of LeMoyne College, member of Memphis and Shelby County Democratic Club, Zuma Bynum Council, the Order of the Eastern Star, graduate of Iona's Beauty College, Memphis Cotton Makers Jubilee, organized Gibson Family of Gospel Singers and Mother of the 1967 Queen and 1968 King of the Memphis Cotton Makers Jubilee.

Agnes, who was a resident of Allenbrooke Nursing and Rehabilitation Center, peacefully entered into eternal rest on Tuesday, December 28, 2004 at the Delta Medical Center in Memphis, Tennessee. A son, Robert Gibson, Jr., preceded her in death.

Her memory will forever be cherished by two daughters, Lois Booker Gailes (Robert) and Debbie A. Gibson of Memphis, Tennessee; four sons, William J. Gibson (Cynthia), Kenneth J.
