



Life Biography



Mr. Lonie Polk Sr. was born on April 7, 1928 in Carrollton, MS, to Mr. Walter Polk and Ms. Maybelle Standberry.

Lonie attended church with his mother and was baptized at the age of 10. He graduated from Pitcher Elementary School in 1943 and JJ Knox High School in 1947. During this time his mother moved to Chicago and his grandmother Willie B Standberry raised him along with his cousins. He learned to work on the family farm and had a paper route. Lonie learned to love the Word of God especially following his Grandpa Eden that was a minister.

After graduation, **Lonie** moved to Chicago to join his mother where he obtained his first job here as a delivery person on Market Street, downtown. **Lonie** was employed by Hart Schauffer Marx until he joined the US Army.

Lonie joined the Armed Services in November 1951 and served at Camp Carson Colorado in Colorado Springs approximately one and a half years. During his tour of duty he chauffeured the Armed Forces Elite including Colonel Poole, Major Wile and Major Askew. He was honorably discharged on April 29, 1953. His Service Rank included Sergeant and Bridge Engineer. He received the Korean Service Medal with two Bronze Stars and The United Nations Service Medal.


Lonie returned home and continued to work at Hart Schauffer Marx. On a trip to Mississippi in February 1955 for a funeral, he met the love of his life, Ella Alexander. He had faith that they would be together, so with continuous prayer and through many letters they were married on Christmas Day, December 25, 1955. They moved to Memphis, TN where he attended Lemoyne Owen College at night and worked as an Insurance Salesman during the day.

To this union, four children were born, Lonnie Jr., Richard James, Larry Levorn, and Michelle Renee. They had Lonnie Jr. and Richard as they resided in Memphis, Tennessee until 1959.

After moving to Chicago in the summer of 1959, he resumed his job at Hart Schauffer and Marx but wasn't happy. He attended Barber College in 1961 and obtained his license becoming a Professional Barber with Cunningham Barbershop until semi-retirement. He continually worked until he got ill.

Lonie and his family joined Fellowship Missionary Baptist Church in August 1977 and remained a faithful member, where he served in many capacities such as a member of the Beautifying Club, a Sunday School teacher, Broadcast prayer counselor, and greeted visitors when his wife could no longer participate. Lonie was a loving and devoted husband, always caring and catering to his wife constantly. When you saw Ella, he wasn't far behind. They were apart of many organizations together such as PTA, Local School Council and Band parents of Simeon for the past 20 years. Lonie loved to serve others, especially other members of Fellowship and family friends; whenever someone needed a ride he was there to make sure they safely made it to their destination.

Lonie leaves to mourn his passing, his devoted wife Ella, three sons: Lonnie Jr., Richard (Cheryl) and Larry (JoSandra), one and only daughter Michelle Polk-Jarmon, Eight grandchildren: James Patton, Larry Polk Jr., Marques Jarmon, Richard Polk II, Candice Jarmon, Bryan Polk, Christopher Polk and Dexter Jarmon, two great-granddaughters: Rachel Jenae Polk and Jaye'Eau Patton, one special niece Joyce Green, a host of cousins, friends, special daughters, sons and and his Fellowship family.

power to go on, no matter the situation. I'm glad I was able to have learned so much from you. I will always love you and I will miss you. *Your best grandson*. *Dexter* 




Grandpa,
