Mamie Carolyn Middleton was born on December 8, 1922 on Wadmalaw Island to William and Carrie Middleton. She is the third oldest of eight children.

Her education began with grade school on Wadmalaw Island, then graduating from Burke High School in Charleston. She then attended Avery Institute in Charleston where she obtained an associate degree in education and finally a bachelor's degree from the University of Massachusetts. She worked in the field of education for thirty years before retiring to re-channel her energies.

She was joined in Holy Matrimony to Samuel Leon Bishop on March 12, 1944 in the parsonage of Ebenezer A.M.E. Church. The Lord blessed this union with three children: Mitzi, Norman and Ray. Her grandchildren are Kai, Bassel, Tarik and Omar Williams. She has one great-granddaughter, Jasmine Alicia Williams.

During her residency in New York, she attended Bridge Street A.M.E. Church in Brooklyn where she worked in the Christian Education Department. She was also a member of the South Carolina Club.
