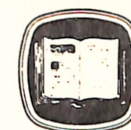

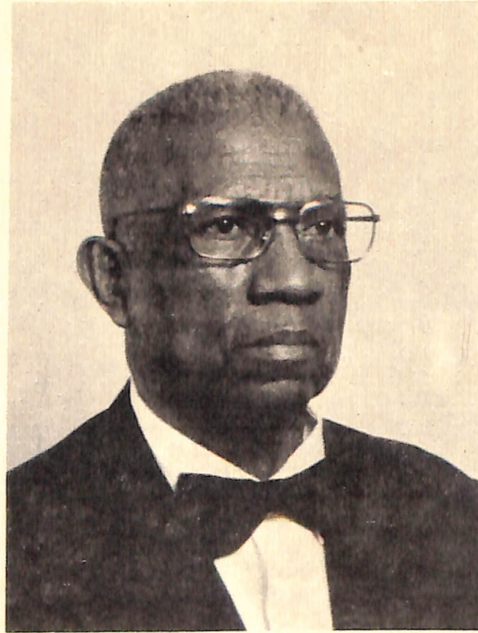

LIFE EPITOME

Mr. Allison Maceo Johnson, the son of Mr. Matthew Elijah Johnson and Mrs. Eva Scruggs Johnson, was born February 13, 1908 in Freestone County, Texas. He grew up in the Salem Community where he received his early training.

On December 31, 1933, he was united in holy matrimony to Miss Eula Mae King, and to this union was born a daughter, Mae Allison.

He confessed Christ at an early age and united with the Salem Baptist Church. He later united with the First Baptist Church South Teague, where he remained until his demise. Among his numerous religious activities were, he served as a deacon for 35 years, financial secretary of the church, assistant superintendent of the Sunday School; president of the Sunday School and BTU Congress for 26 years, and a member of the International Brotherhood.

He departed this life, April 26, 1981 at the Teague General Hospital, Teague, Texas.

Johnson, Bryan, Texas; a devoted wife, Mrs. Eula Mae Johnson, Teague, Texas; a daughter, Mrs. Mae Allison Jackson, Waco, Texas; two granddaughters, Andrea Bernyce and Tammie Denise Jackson, Waco, Texas; two sisters, Bennie Lange, Houston, Texas and Mary Shackleford of Bryan, Texas; four brothers, Matt Johnson and Billy Johnson of Teague, Texas, Matthew Johnson of Dallas, Texas, George Johnson of Omaha, Nebraska; a son-in-law, Howard Jackson, Waco, Texas; one aunt, Mrs. Cora Glenn, Los Angeles, California; and many nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.

After receiving his secondary education from Central Texas Academy, Waco, Texas, he attended Jarvis Christian College, Hawkins, and Samuel Huston College, Austin, Texas, where he received a Bachelor Degree. He later received a Master Degree of Arts from Texas Southern University, Houston, Texas. Mr. Johnson worked in the public school system as a teacher and administrator for 30 years.

He was very active in civic and fraternal organizations and served in many positions. He was a former scout master of Troop 242 BSA; Secretary-Treasurer of the Teague United Way; a member of the Retired Teachers Association; a member of the Board of Directors of the Teague General Hospital, Chairman of the Teague Housing Authority; Past President of the Rotary Club; a member of Phylaxis Society; a member of Imperial Council of the Mystic Shrine; a member of Holy Royal Arch PHA; Commander-in-Chief of W. R. Roberts Consistory No. 279; W. M. of Bess Roberts Lodge No. 29; President of S. E. Masonic Federal Credit Union; District Deputy Grand Master, District 4; and Grand Emminent Commander of Knights of Templar of Texas. To these organizations he rendered dedicated and untiring services.
