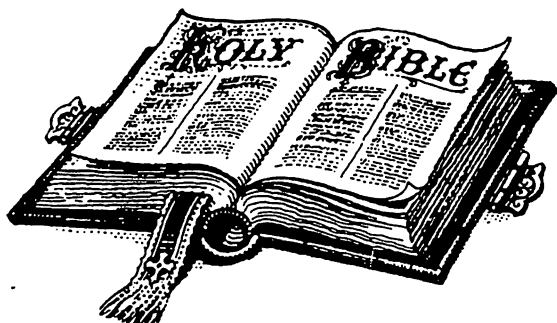

His education was received in the public schools of Charleston County, and his religious training at St. Peters AME Church Sunday School, North Charleston.

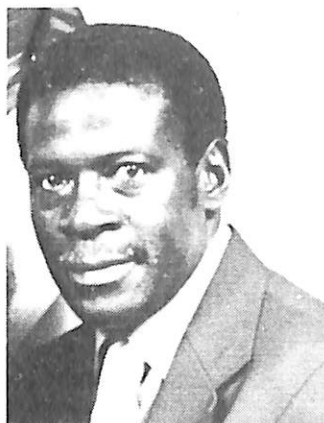
On July 3, 1954, he was united in holy wedlock to the former Gloria Nesbitt; to this union two children were born.
