

Julia M. Wright affectionately known as "Pinky" was born to the late Reverend William and Mamie Green Smith on June 12, 1937, in Charleston, South Carolina.

Julia attended the public schools of Charleston County. She was a 1955 graduate of Haut Gap and Gresham Meggett Schools. As a youth she began working to provide clothing for her brother, Charles Smith and her niece, Carolyn McClair.

In 1956, she married the love of her life, Thomas Wright, Sr. She and Thomas were married for fifty-four blissful years. During their marriage they were blessed with eight children. From those eight children they received additional blessings of twenty-four grandchildren, twenty-three great-grandchildren and two great great-grandchildren. She was a loving and devoted wife to Thomas, helping him to achieve his high rank of Lieutenant as a City of Charleston Police Officer. Her beloved husband, Thomas, preceded her in death.

While married and caring for her family and working full time, she continued to strive for academic excellence by receiving her bachelor's degree in Early Childhood Development at The Citadel and the College of Charleston with a minor in Teacher's Education. Because of her desire to be the best at her chosen profession she attended Shaw University, Charleston Chapter, graduating with the honor of Cum laude. She received a Masters Degree in Psychology. Julia's faith and love of people lead her to attend and graduate from Seminary School.

Julia's work history included Director of DSS Head Start Program, assistant Director of Shaw Day Care Center and as an administrative Assistant; giving her a total of 28 years of service under the Department of Social Services. She was owner and sole proprietor of Wright's Day Care Center. Her work history also included Philos Ford and Dillard's Department Store. Julia was a faithful worker until her retirement in 2003. After retiring, she spent loving hours with her grandchildren and traveling with her family until her illness in 2006.

Julia and Thomas were family oriented. Family meant everything to them. Their early rising in the morning and their laying down at night began and ended with family. Momma was a true believer in discipline, but it was always with love.

We never felt unloved, she was always there to teach us God's word and provide us with knowledge. She encouraged us to strive to be more and to always keep family first.

Julia was a faithful and life long member of St. James Bethel AME Church. She served in many capacities that expanded more then 30 years. She served as Class Leader of Class #10, as head of the class Leaders Council, she wrote and presented, the first Leaders Guide Book which provided valuable insight to then present and incoming leaders. She was an Usher, served as recording secretary, correspondence secretary, Sunday School Superintendent, member of the Pastor's Aide Board, Ushers Council and the Steward Board.

She was a member of various organizations where she gave her service freely. Past President of Arabian Temple #139, (United Order of Tent St. Mary Division), Youth Department Parent Committee, a member of St. Mary's Tent #6, and of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

Julia's new life in Heaven has reunited her with her beloved Thomas. We will miss her dearly but we know she's resting in the arms of God, Our Father.
