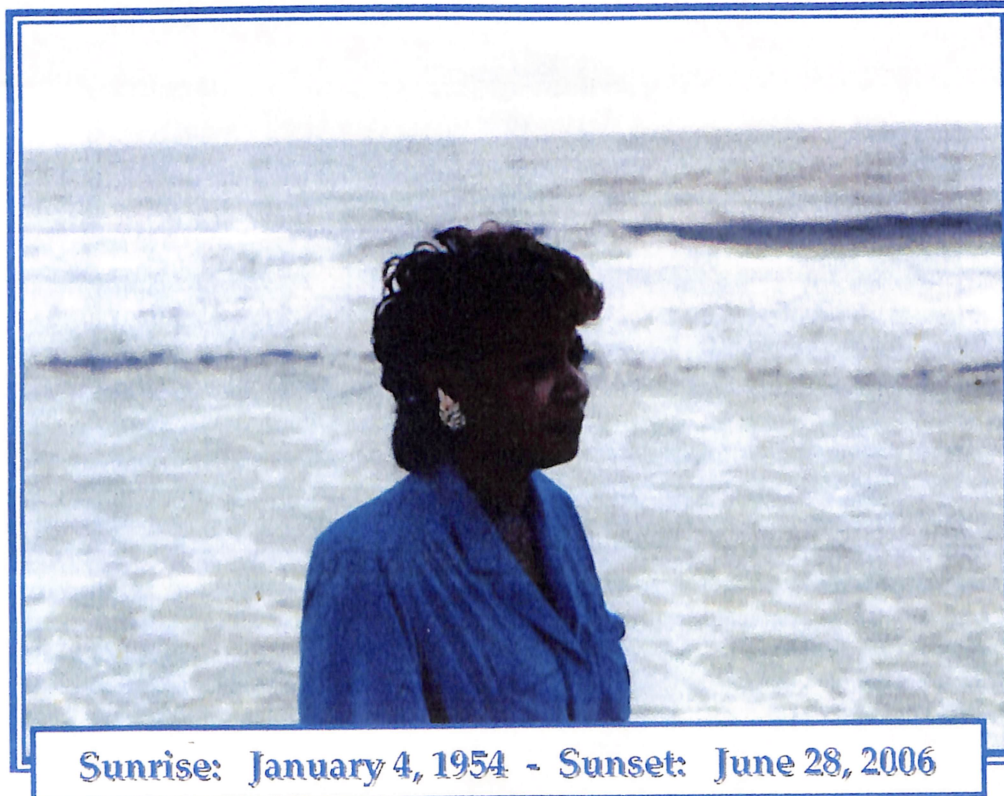

Till we are home with God some answers have to wait.

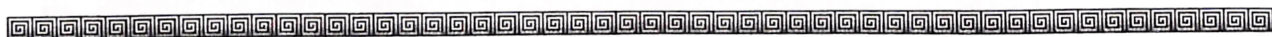
