"THIS IS HER LIFE"

I, Mardes Wilson Battle, the fourth child of ten children born to Mrs. Adeline Johnson Wilson and Willis Wilson, was born in Panola County May 31, 1920, seven miles west of Batesville, Mississippi. I grew up on the farm in a religious home of six children, two boys and four girls. I am a member of the Baptist Church. Attended Macedonia Elementary School under Prof. J. E. Bell's administration. After I completed the 8th. grade my father's income was too low to send me to High School, so I, determined not to give up kept on in the 8th grade another 3 years making a total of 4 years. I was so determined to finish High School that after 4 years in the 8th grade I asked my mother to let me stay with an Aunt in Batesville, and that is how I got my start.

One day in my Senior year at Batesville Colored High School, Mrs. G. B. White, our Jeanes Supervisor making her visit to the school, talked with the Seniors, and inspired me to be a teacher. After graduating from High School I had to go into the Teaching Profession to further my education. I attended Jackson and Rust College receiving a B.S. Degree in Elementary Education from Rust College June 4, 1956, and has done graduate work at Tennessee A. & I. State University, Nashville, Tenn. where

I plan to get a Master's Degree in Elementary Education. (On August 8, 1959, she received a Master's Degree in Elementary

Education from Tennessee A & I State University, Nashville Tennessee. She became the 1st Black Woman of Panola County to receive a Master's Degree.)

I taught 9 years at Macedonia Elem. School, and am now in my 5th year at Batesville Colored High School. All of these years I have taught the First Grade, with the exception of one term when I taught First, Second and 5th grades, and 6 grade History and Geography.

I like all sports, Basketball and Baseball being my favorites.

Reading is my hobby, I like to sit and read for hours and hours.

While teaching at the Batesville Colored High School, I met and married a quiet homely and handsome gentleman, Henry C. Battle. We have one daughter 18 months old.
