Life Reflections

Viola Abraham Burgess, a woman of strength and dignity, is a native of North Charleston, South Carolina. The daughter of Ruth Abraham, she was raised by her uncle and aunt, Isaiah and Alicia Abraham.

Known affectionately as "Vi", she was educated in the schools of Charleston, South Carolina; Savannah, Georgia and Chicago, Illinois. Vi's professional training was received at Palmetto Beauty College School and Rice

Business College.

At an early age, "Vi" became an active member of St. Peters A.M.E. Church. "Vi" served in many different capacities at St. Peters including Sunday School Teacher, Secretary, Organizer and Director of the Junior Gospel Singers and a member of the Senior Choir and the Trustee Board. She organized the Adult Class #2 of St. Peters Sunday School in September 1978 under the pastorate of Rev. George W. Brown and Bro. Frank Mallette, Superintendent.

In December 1959, Viola was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Rev. Fred D. Burgess. She then became an active member of her husband's churches: St. Luke A.M.E. Church and Mt. Horr A.M.E. Church of the

South Carolina Conferences.

While in the South Carolina Conferences, her concern for the needy, aged and incapacitated endeared her to many. She was a past chairperson of the Senior Missionary Society and past Conference Branch Director of the Young People's Division of the South Carolina Conference Missionary Society. She was a delegate on two occasions for the Missionary Quadrennial Convention. In 1960, she was presented a plaque for dedicated and loyal support to the YPDers of the South Carolina Conference.

In addition to church work, "Vi" was active in civic, social and fraternal organizations. She was a founder, chairperson, and leader of the Homemakers Sewing Club, and she assisted with the mural design of the Liberty Hill Beautification Committee at the Felix Pinckney Community Center. She served as Assistant Matron of Queen Esther Chapter #166, Order of Eastern Stars, and she was the founder, organizer and leader of Queen of Sheba Tent #202, United Order of Tents, a Chairperson of the Grant Past Officers of the J.R. Gidden and Jollifee Union Southern District #4. Additionally, she was a member of the National Biennial Encampment. She was also a member of the Sea Breeze Temple Order of Elks.


Vi's professional career began as a cosmetologist where she was the owner and operator of Vi's Beauty Parlor. Leaders and young girls from miles around could count on Vi to give them a serious press and curl for any and every event. Other employment included work as a substitute teacher, library assistant, telephone operator and election poll manager.

Rev. Burgess chose to share the later years of his life in wedded bliss with Viola Abraham. Rev. and Mrs. Burgess created a unique and special relationship based on a love of God and of each other. The wonderful memories of that extraordinary period brought many moments of comfort as she lived her life as a minister's

widow.

After a period of illness, Vi chose to answer the call and claimed the victory on Sunday morning, October 8, 2000.
