She attended the public schools of Charleston County, earned certificates from the House of God Academy and Bible College, and completed courses leading to a degree from the Moody Bible Institute. One of her greatest educational successes was being able to teach her children and help them with their homework in every subject.

She met, grew affectionate toward, and married James L. Ravenell of Charleston South Carolina. She began her Christian life at Mt Olive Baptist church in North Charleston where she received the Holy Ghost, August 11, 1943. In the fall of 1945, she joined and dedicated her life of service to the House of God – Keith Dominion. Her greatest Christian triumph is experiencing over one thousand souls receiving the Holy Ghost. She often spoke of the time in Ridgeville with the Delees, Iola and Sam Williams and driving to Pamplico for years, meeting the Andrews.

She and her husband, Bishop James Ravenell joined the House of God when their daughter, Mary Elizabeth was just one-year-old. Mother enjoyed serving the church in many capacities. She was a part of the National Complex committee, Deacons Union, Chief Overseer's Anniversary Committee, and the International Missionary Outreach Society. One of her supreme joys was the time spent in Jamaica. Through her daughter, Margaret Catherine, she cruised the Mediterranean Sea and ministered in Madrid, Spain as guests of a community church organized by her daughter. In Mississippi, she served in the Piedmont Diocese of South Carolina. Finally, it must be noted that she took many saints and visitors to the General Assembly in Nashville, Tennessee, often providing food, clothing, and shelter for them. She loved people and her legacy continues in her children.
