



Life Reflections

Dee Etta Washington-Jones was born to the parentage of Wade and Theresa (Solomon) Washington April 16, 1926 in Freestone County, Texas. Being the oldest of 5, she was required to tend to daily farm chores before school. Additionally, Dee Etta was nurtured by both paternal and maternal grandparents.

Dee Etta accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her savior at an early age. She began and completed her education in the Butler School System where she exemplified high academic achievement. She furthered her studies at Mary Allen College where she received a certificate in the Social Sciences.

On July 12, 1944, Dee Etta married William Jones, Jr. To this union four boys and two girls were born. She united with St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church under the pastorage of C. D. Knight. Dee Etta was a faithful member at Mt. Tabor Missionary Baptist Church where she served on various auxiliaries including the establishment of the Golden Ministry. She also served as a PTA board member from 1954 to 1978. During this time she volunteered in the Right to Vote Campaign for African Americans by knocking on doors to inform citizens of their legal right to vote. Dee Etta was employed with the Dallas County Community Action Committee working on campaigns for nutrition, voters' rights and equal rights for minorities.

She was employed with the Parks and Recreation Department for the City of Dallas until she retired in 1991. After retirement she was sequestered to work by a leading Dallas tennis pro and in time was asked to work with the Dallas Tennis Association. She once again retired in January 2008.

Other affiliations include the National Council of Negro Women Metro Section, Dallas County Elections Department, The Dallas Urban League, The American Association of Retired People, The Senior Citizens of Greater Dallas, The American Heart Association and the Happy Ladies Social Club.

Preceding her in death were her parents, William Jones, Jr. (husband), Humphrey L. Jones (son), Sheryl Denise Jones-Williams (daughter), Essie Lee Washington-Willis (sister), and Marie Washington (sister).

She leaves to cherish her precious memories one daughter: Deborah Jones-Matthews Perry; and three sons: Roderick L. Jones, Donald W. Jones, and Anthony D. Jones. Other family members include thirteen grandchildren and six great-grandchildren. God children include Harold and Gloria Carter, Reggie Carter, Wayne Moss, Michael T. Richardson, Norris D. Fain, Rose Taylor and confidant Barbara McCoy.
