

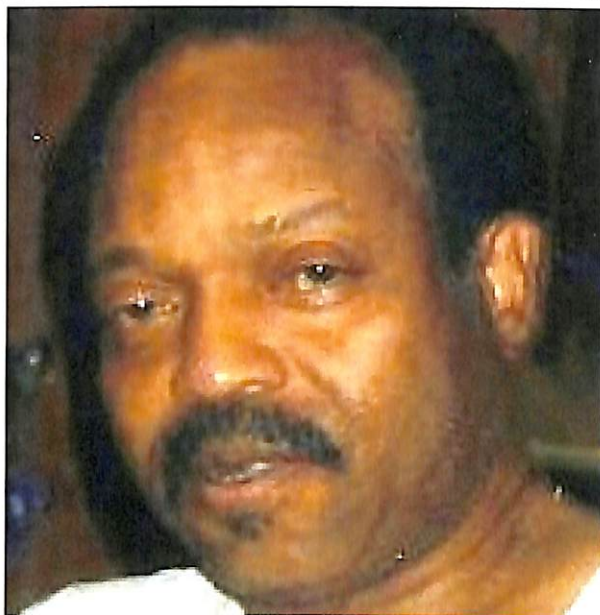

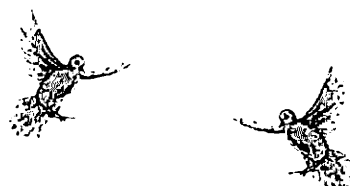
Obituary

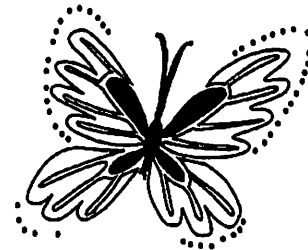
APPRECIATION
