OBITUARY

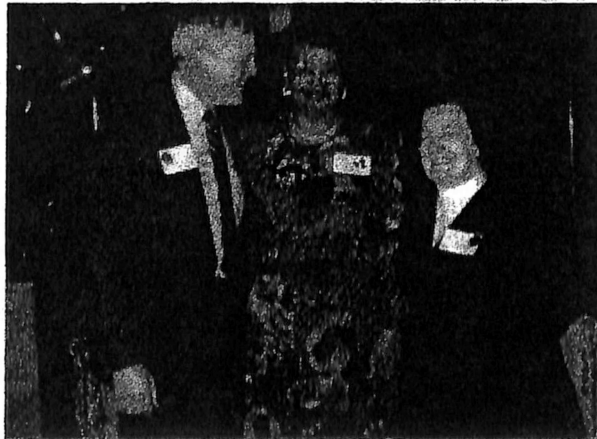
