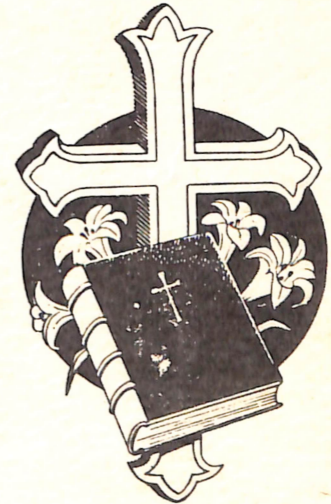

OBITUARY

Mrs. Sarah Jackson was born September 17, 1895, in Bethel Community, Oakwood, Texas, the youngest of seventeen children of the late Rev. George Solomon and his third wife, Mrs. Lydia Solomon.

She received her public school education in the Bethel Elementary School and grew to young womanhood in her native community.

At an early age, she accepted Christ and joined the Bethel Baptist Church, under the pastorate of the Rev. Jesse Davis, actively and willingly involving herself in the various programs of the church.

On July 10, 1913 she was married to Mr. Sherman Jackson, to this union four children were born, one of whom preceded her in death. After her marriage, she joined the Lone Star Baptist Church where her husband was a member. Ever faithful and sincere, she combined the duties of wife and mother, always concerned about the welfare of her family and thinking no sacrifice was too great to assure their well being and happiness. At the same time, she devoted herself to her church as well as to other religious affiliations. Her Christian service reached into many areas and she willingly served Lone Star Baptist Church as treasurer for twenty years, Sunday School teacher, secretary of the Missionary Society, and chairperson of the program committee. For 42 years, she was the efficient secretary of the Lebanon District Association.

A member of East Lake Court No. 109, Heroines of Jericho, she served as matron for more than 30 years.

She remained ever faithful to her church until ill health curtailed her activities, but her interest and support remained constant to the end.

Death came peacefully on November 7, in Hillcrest Baptist Hospital in Waco, Texas, and this valiant soldier surrendered her soul to her Lord and Master.

Survivors include: two daughters and sons-in-law, Mrs. Ulaya (Edward) Pipkin, Houston, Texas; Mrs. Ernie Lee (Marcus) Sheppard, Waco, Texas; one son and daughter-in-law, Dr. and Mrs. J.
