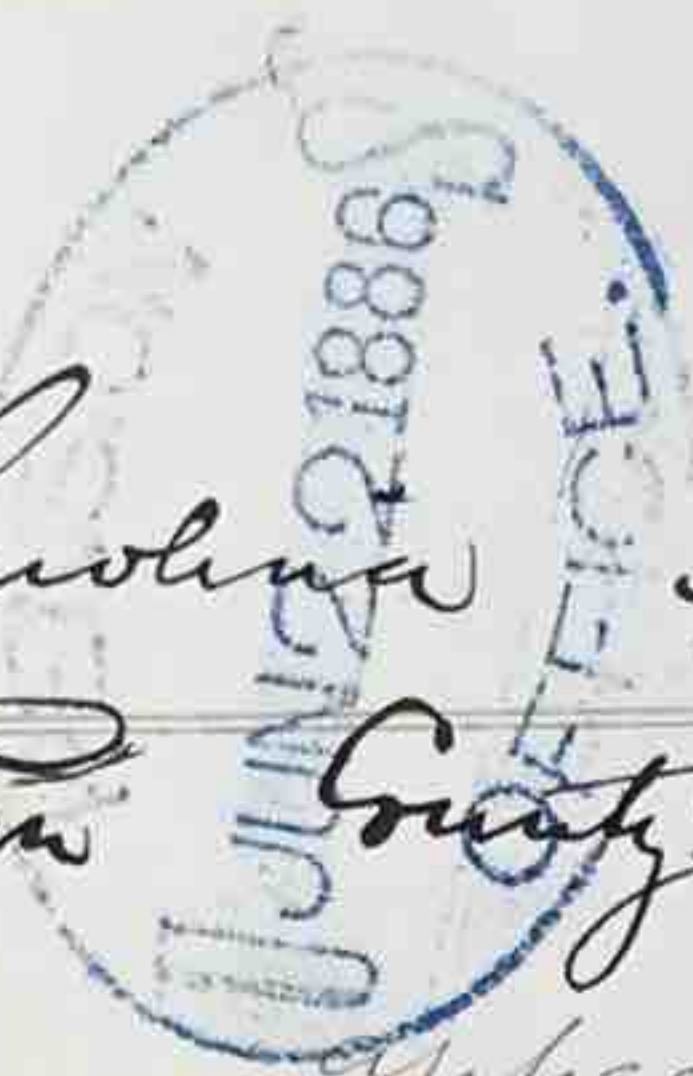

The physician, in order to cover the required points, should read carefully the following notes, and unless they are complied with the affidavit will be worthless and ineffective:

Sir:

Minus Washington (colored) is unreliable. He is a very ignorant man & can be induced to say "yes" to almost any thing. In answer to my questions he made the following statement.

"I was not in the army. I have known this Clint. & her son's husband Primus Mitchell since long before the war, one belonged to the same master. I know that Primus Mitchell was a soldier & I saw him soon after he was discharged. He was not well when he came back, but grew better in a month or so. After about a year he was taken sick & soon died. He lived in this city from day discharge up to his death. He told me that he had been wounded but I never saw the wound & don't know in what part of his body it was located. When he was sick I used to go & see him. He had a bad cough and spit up lots of matter. I thought he had some consumption. He was so thin. I had not seen him for several weeks before he died & cannot say what caused his death.

"The Clint & soldier's had three children - girls. The eldest is named "Pigeon" the next Lydia. I don't recollect the name of the youngest. The Clint. has lived in this city a portion of the time since the war & the balance of the time up on the "Santee River". I know that she has not had a husband while living in this city & never knew or heard that she had remarried. I never see her when she is up on the river.

"I made my mark in a paper in her claim. I don't know what it contained as I cannot read & it was not read to me"

I enlisted in the 33rd U.S.C.T. before he did, and did not see him while in service until some time later. I was at the docks at Beaufort S.C. when a boat came there with some wounded and I saw Primus Mitchell carried from the boat on a stretcher. I did not talk with him & never saw him after that. I cannot say in what battle he was wounded nor where the wound was located. Nor can I say when this was - in what year.

"I signed an affidavit in this case - but I don't know what was in it."

From this evasive manner which I questioned him - I am satisfied that he knows nothing about the case whatever.
