She was united in holy matrimony to Hollis Hoskins, Jr. in 1952. To this union eight children were born.

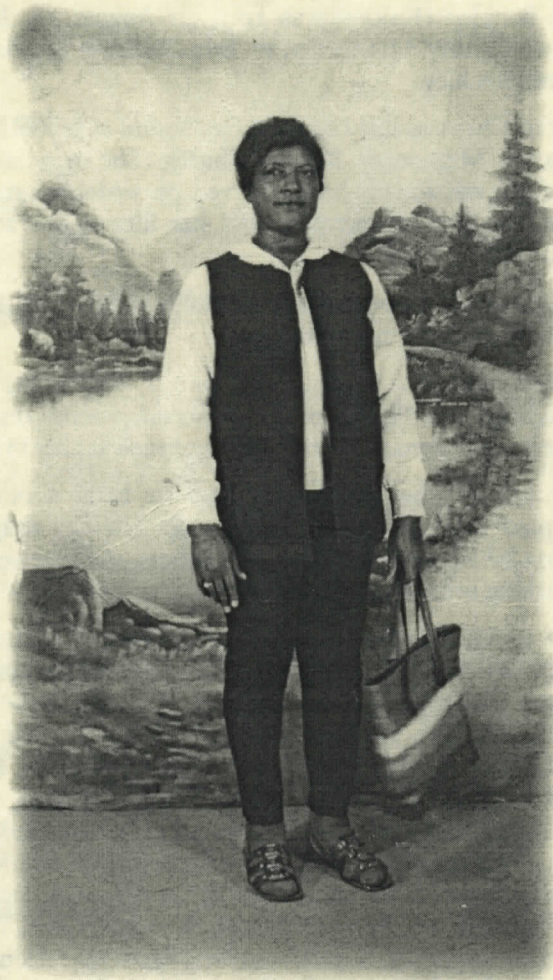
