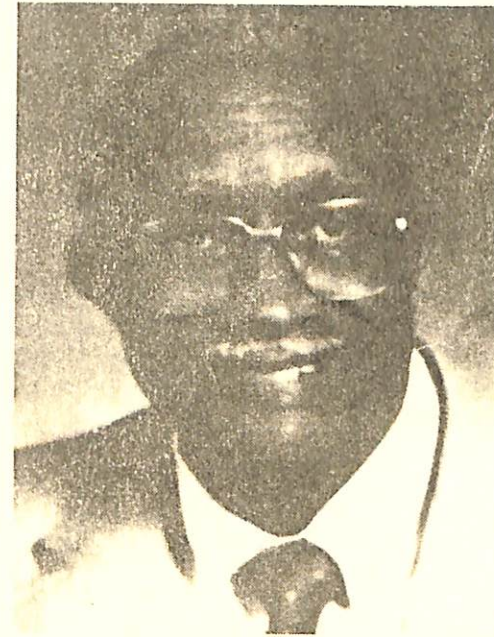

HOLLIS DAVID SUMTER, of the 1100 block of E. Indian River Road, departed this life on November 17, 1995 at a hospital in Baltimore, Maryland.
