Bailey was born on June 11, 1894 in freestone County, where he grew up and attended public school. He Married his wife Sarah on January 18, 1913. He moved to Navarro County and united with St. James Baptist Church where he served as Chairman of the Deacon Board, and Superintendent of the Sunday School until his death.

He was a God fearing man, who loved humanity, and shared with those in need. He was a good husband and father. He taught his children to put God first in their lives and they would make it.

He died on March 21, 1942, and is buried in the Chatfield, Texas Cemetery.
