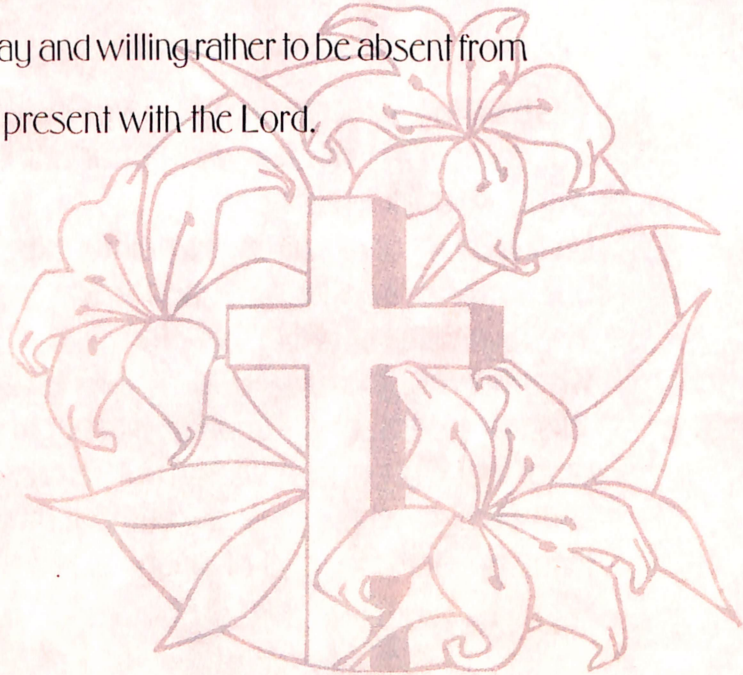


II Corinthian, 5; 1, 6-8

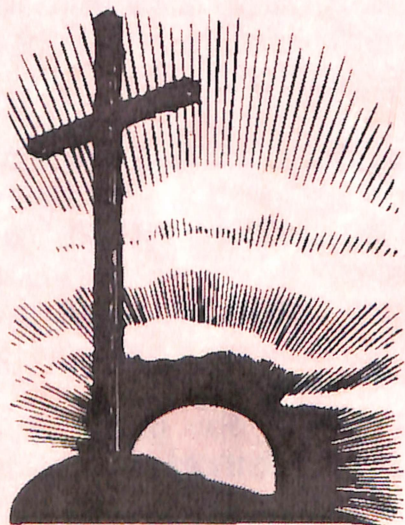
