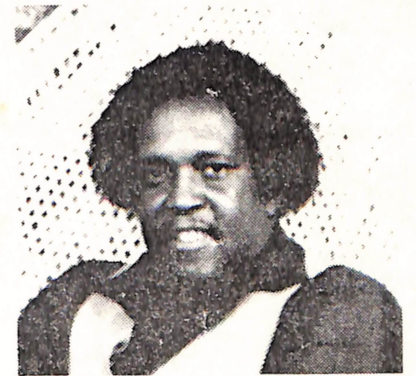

On April 30, 1996, the death angel appeared and silently carried Olden Billy Titus away.

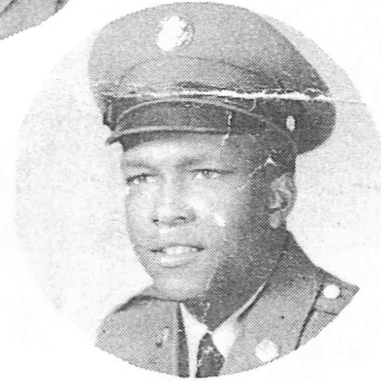
He confessed Christ and became a member of Soul Harbor Church of God in Christ.
