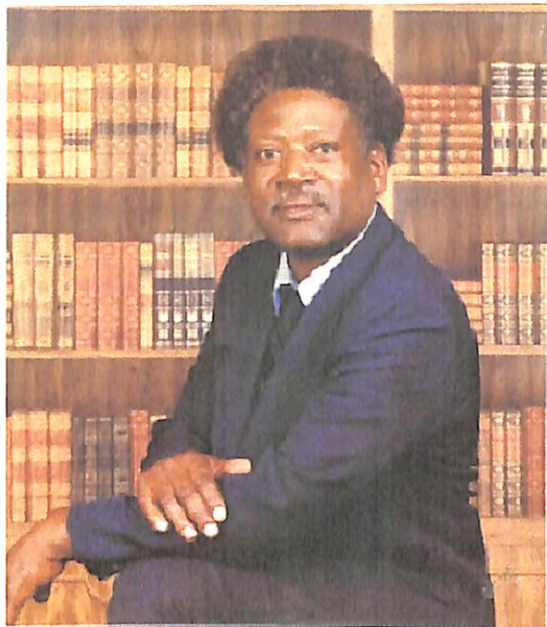

The Obituary

Abraham McQueen, son of the late Bascom and Isabell McQueen was born March 5, 1934 in Dillon, South Carolina.

He was educated in the public schools of Lakeview, South Carolina. He served in the U.S. Army and received an honorable discharge. He worked as a civil service employee with the Charleston Naval Shipyard and after thirty years and more of dedicated service, he then retired. He also retired as a school crossing guard with the Charleston County School District.

On May 13, 1956, Abraham McQueen was united in holy matrimony to Remell Palmer. From that union two children were born.
